



Here in Augusta County, we enjoy a strong partnership with the Commonwealth of Virginia. We can add to the state's incentives with our own local incentive programs. All projects are evaluated individually and confidentially.

Virginia Economic Development Incentives

Incentives are Virginia's investment in its economic future. Through the following cash grants, Virginia continues to demonstrate its willingness to invest in those who invest and reinvest in the Commonwealth.

Commonwealth's Opportunity Fund

A discretionary incentive available to the Governor to secure a business location or expansion project in Virginia. Grants are awarded to localities on a local matching basis with the expectation that the grant will result in a favorable location decision for the Commonwealth.

Governor's Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development Fund

Invests in agricultural industries through strategic grants made to businesses that add value to Virginia-grown agricultural and forestal products.

Virginia Investment Partnership Grant

A discretionary performance incentives designed to encourage continued capital investment by Virginia companies, which result in added capacity, modernization, increased productivity, or the creation, development and utilization of advanced technology. Virginia values its existing businesses and enacts grants to support their success.

Virginia Jobs Investment Program

An incentive program offering customized recruiting and training assistance to companies that create new jobs or experience technological change. The program is designed to reduce human resource development cost by providing direct funding to new and expanding companies that meet program qualifications.



Port of Virginia Incentives

The Port of Virginia is the deepest port on the east coast. The following incentives are designed to increase port volume and are available throughout Virginia:

Port Volume Increase Tax Credit

Tax credit of \$50/TEU for taxpayers engaged in the manufacture of goods or the distribution of manufactured goods, agricultural entities, or mineral and gas entities that use Virginia ports and increase cargo volume through the facility by 5% in a single calendar year over their base year cargo volume.

Barge and Rail Usage Tax Credit

Tax credit of \$25/TEU in excess of the number of containers shipped by barge or rail during the immediately preceding taxable year rather than by truck or other motor vehicle on Virginia's highways.

International Trade Facility Tax Credit

Tax credit for either creation of new jobs (\$3,500/FTE) or capital investment (2%) in an international trade facility as a result of moving 5% more cargo through a Virginia port than in the preceding taxable year.

Economic and Infrastructure Development Grant

For new or expanding business that creates at least 25 FT jobs, uses a Virginia port, and engages in a specific targeted industry, may earn up to \$3,000 per job.

Augusta County Incentives

Augusta County's local incentives are considered on a case-by-case basis and are based on an analysis of job creation, capital investment, and wage rates.

Local incentives may include:

- Cash grants
- Infrastructure development
- Fee waivers
- Tax refunds for increased investments in machinery & tools, real estate, and personal property
- Project specific incentives

DEVELOPMENT AREAS

Within Augusta County's sprawling 1,000 miles, many industry clusters are concentrated around geographic assets. Mill Place Commerce Park is the county-owned commerce park situated in the center of the County and built around a strong commerce and industrial cluster at the intersection of Interstates 81 and 64. Stuarts Draft, with ample water and sewer capacity and large land parcels, has developed as a major processing and manufacturing cluster. Augusta County's emerging life sciences cluster, LifeCore, is anchored by Augusta Health hospital and the Murphy Deming College of Health Sciences in Fishersville. In the northernmost part of the County, an aviation cluster has developed around the Shenandoah Valley Regional Airport.

Mill Place Commerce Park

Commerce & Industrial Cluster | Verona

Located ½ mile from interstate 81 at exit 227, Mill Place Commerce Park is owned by Augusta County and located in Verona, Virginia. Mill Place is a 400-acre planned commerce park with zoning designed to accommodate a variety of business uses ranging from hospitality to general industrial in a compatible and complementary format. The Park enjoys interstate visibility with backgrounds of forested tracts and ponds.

The new one-mile corridor in Fishersville, LifeCore Drive, serves as the hub for this emerging sector. Augusta County boasts more farm acreage than any other Virginia county, with 1,729 farms on 286,195 acres. As the second largest agriculture producing county in Virginia, Augusta County ranks first in the state for production of beef cattle, sheep and lambs, and second in milk cow production. Augusta County has more than 30,000 head of beef cattle and 9,000 sheep and lambs. The County is also one of the state's largest poultry producers.

Air

The Shenandoah Valley Regional Airport (SHD), located in Augusta County, services the region and provides consistent, excellent service with three daily flights to Dulles International Airport. With free parking and quick security checks, SHD is a great asset to a business community that works locally and thinks globally.

In addition to SHD, Augusta County is within a two-hour drive to four other airports, including:

Rail

Two of the nation's largest railroads, Norfolk Southern and CSX, intersect in Augusta County. We also have two hardworking short-line rail companies, Buckingham Branch Railroad and Shenandoah Valley Railroad.

Port of Virginia

Located just over 200 miles from Augusta County, the Port of Virginia is the deepest port on the East Coast and is the only U.S. East Coast port with congressional authorization for 55-foot deep channels.

Port of Virginia Quick Facts:

Located 77 miles from Augusta County, the Virginia Inland Port (VIP) is an intermodal container transfer facility in Front Royal, Virginia. The terminal brings The Port of Virginia 220 miles closer to inland markets and enhances service to the Washington D.C. / Baltimore Metro Region by providing rail service to the terminals in Hampton Roads. VIP also consolidates and containerizes local cargo for export. Intermodal rail cars arrive at VIP and gain access via Norfolk Southern rail to Harrisburg, PA and New York/New Jersey region. The facility is a U.S. Customs-designated port of entry, and the full range of customs functions is available to customers.
